

Short descriptions of the legislative bills used for the 2022 Legislature Ratings in the Assembly

- 1) **A.195 Gottfried/S.995 Hoylman:** CPNYS supports this bill that provides for additional remedies for patients' private right of action in residential health care facilities.
- 2) A.2358-B Peoples-Stokes/S.3468-B Kennedy: CPNYS opposes the bill that establishes the office of racial equity and social justice.
- 3) **A.2632-A Bronson/S.774-B Hoylman**: CPNYS opposes this bill that requires the collection of certain demographic information by certain state agencies, boards and commissions.
- 4) A.6328-A Cruz/S.6586-A Liu: CPNYS opposes this bill that applies the term citizenship or immigration status to the various lists of protected classes through the different areas of the Human Rights Law that allows for civil and criminal offenses.
- 5) **A.6318-B Stern/S.772-A Kaminsky:** CPNYS supports the establishment of a blue alert system to aid in the apprehension of any individual (s) suspected of kicking or seriously wounding any law enforcement officer.
- 6) **A.6678-E Walker/S.1046-E Myrie:** CPNYS opposes this bill that establishes rights of action for denying or abridging the right of any member of a protected class to vote; provides assistance to language-minority groups, requiring preclearance for potential violations of the NYVRA and creates civil liability for voter intimidation.
- 7) **A.7926-A Rosenthal, L /S.4116-A Hoylman:** CPNYS opposes this bill that requires semiautomatic pistols manufactured or delivered to any licensed dealer in this state to be capable of microstamping ammunition.
- 8) **A.8849 Paulin/S.8435 Comrie:** CPNYS opposes this bill that requires certain companies and corporations report certain data regarding the gender, race and ethnicity of their employees.

- 9) **A.8718 Englebright/S.7788 Harckham:** CPNYS opposes this bill one hundred percent of in-state sales of new passenger cars and trucks shall be zero emissions by two thousand thirty-five.
- 10) **A.9007-C Budget/S.8007-C Budget:** CPNYS opposes this budget bill as it provides tax dollars to be used to abort unborn babies.
- 11) **A.9009-C Budget/S.8009-C Budget:** CPNYS supports this budget bill that enacts major components of legislation which are necessary to implement the state fiscal plan while cutting various taxes.
- 12) **A.9040-A Zebrowski/S.8185-A Gianaris:** CPNYS opposes this bill that established the 150 assembly and 63 senate districts for the 2022 and subsequent elections that were ultimately ruled invalid by the NYS Court of Appeals.
- 13) **A.9167 Zebrowski/S.8196 Gianaris:** CPNYS opposes this bill that established the congressional districts and were ultimately ruled invalid by the NYS Court of Appeals.
- 14) **A.9283 Peoples-Stokes/S.8084-A Hinchey:** CPNYS opposes this bill that establishes temporary conditional adult-use cultivator license and a temporary processor license that seeks to bolster the social equity program required by the Cannabis Law. Federal Law still considers Cannabis a Schedule 1 Drug under the Controlled Substance Act.
- 15) **A.9418-A Cruz/S.8884-A Hoylman:** CPNYS is adamantly opposed to all discrimination, but believes that creating a new program and fund under the DOH AIDs Institute is not the most efficient way to help; rather it just creates another bureaucracy for the TGNB community to get lost in and not get the help they really need.
- 16) **A.9877-A Cruz/S.2903-A Kavanagh:** CPNYS is opposed to this bill that requires notification of alien defendants during the plea process, that pleading guilty to a misdemeanor or violation may subject them to automatic removal (deportation) or denial of naturalization as required by a 1996 federal law.
- 17) **A.10094-A Burdick/S.9039-A Biaggi:** CPNYS opposes this bill that establishes a cause of action for unlawful interference with protected rights of NY residents and would allow those seeking abortion care or gender affirming care from out of state the same constitutional protections afforded to NY residents by the NYS Constitution.
- 18) **A.10372-A Rules (Lavine)/S.9077-A Krueger:** CPNYS opposes this bill that seeks to provide judicial protections to abortion providers or those aiding in the performance of an abortion within New York who may come to New York to perform abortions.

- 19) **A.10439 Rules (Fahy)/S.9405 Parker:** CPNYS opposes this so called green bill that will significantly increase landlord costs for both commercial and residential properties with pass through costs to tenants for the foreseeable future
- 20) **A.10503 Rules (Jackson)/S.9458 Thomas:** CPNYS opposes this bill that establishes a prospective permit to purchase semiautomatic rifles without affecting people who currently own this type of weapon.
- 21) **A.41001 Rules (Heastie)/S.51001 Stewart-Cousins:** CPNYS opposes this expansive gun control measure introduced in response to the SCOTUS concealed carry decision.
- 22) A.41002 Rules (Seawright)/S.51002 Stewart-Cousins: CPNYS opposes this Constitutional Amendment (The Equal Rights Amendment) that seeks to establish full equality and justice; the equality right to be free from discrimination, and in particular those who have faced severe and pervasive injustice. It seeks to expand the list of classes protected by the NY Constitution in recognition of the need for comprehensive and intersectional (a framework for conceptualizing a person, group of people, or social problem as affected by a number of discriminations and disadvantages) equality under the law.
- 23) **A.9007-C Budget:** CPNYS supports this motion that seeks to amend the budget bill that requires taxpayers to pay for abortions through Medicaid.
- 24) **A.6666 Joyner:** CPNYS opposes this bill that seeks to require the Commissioner of Labor to waive certain overpayments of unemployment benefits paid during COVID-19. It is estimated that NY paid roughly \$115 million in overpayments, and even if in error, every effort must be made to recover all of the monies.
- 25) **A.9435 Solages:** CPNYS opposes the establishment of a New York state community commission on reparations remedies to make determinations regarding compensation.

The first 22 bills passed both legislative houses; the last 3 were one house bills
